Christ Lutheran Church Surveys

Enclosed are two copies each of two surveys. Directions are on the top of each survey.

- Survey #1—Congregational Current and Future Direction—blue paper
- Survey #2—Pastoral Characteristics—green paper

The purpose of the surveys is to provide members of a call committee for a second pastor, and members who will be developing a strategic plan, with input from all members of the congregation.

All survey questions are in the form of statements. You are asked to react to most questions by marking one of five responses.

The ELCA has a 12-page form that has a number of questions that are used to match our congregation with the right candidates for our second pastor position. A number of the survey questions match the questions on that form, and their numbers are in **bold type**. All other survey questions were submitted by congregation members, and only confirmed members of Christ Lutheran Church will be asked to complete the surveys. This is important because the survey process is limited to the views of our congregation members.

The deadline for completing and returning the surveys is **Sunday, May 20**. You may submit completed surveys by:

- depositing them in the box on the information counter
- returning them to the church office by mail or in person
- submitting them online using the church's website at www.clcstoughton.org

Since many of our households have two members, one survey each for those two members is enclosed. Postal service regulations require that all items mailed bulk rate have the same content and same weight. To save postage, survey instruments were included in the May *Ambassador* that is mailed to every household.

If you are a single-member household, please complete one each of the two surveys and discard or return the others. Households with more than two confirmed members may make copies of the survey instruments, pick up additional copies at the information table, download copies from the church's website, or submit completed surveys online. Paper color of copied or downloaded surveys does not need to match the enclosed surveys.

Survey results will be available on the church website in early June. Printed copies will be available on the information counter at church.

A group of members will analyze survey results. Those results will be available to the congregation and call committee by the end of summer.

Accompanying the Senegal YAGMs

During the months of February and March, I visit each of the YAGMs in their host communities for the second time during their YAGM year. This second visit is different than the first, because by now, the YAGMs are more integrated into the fabric of their communities and into their daily work life. They have also arrived at a point in the year (6-7 months in Senegal) where they have started to reflect on how their year in Senegal has changed, challenged, and formed them as young adults.

It is during this second visit that I tend to realize once again that while we in the ELCA talk about accompaniment as the way in which we engage in relationship with our partners in ministry, more often than not in the YAGM program, it is our partners who truly accompany the YAGM. It is Lily's Roman Catholic host mother, Mama Ndour, who has shown her what it looks like to cling to God's hope and joy in the midst of unexpected loss. It is Kristian's Muslim supervisor, Mariame, who has given her adult life to serve the health care needs of the most vulnerable in the community through her leadership within Senegalese Lutheran Development Services. It is Berkley's host cousin, Corrine, who has invited Berkley and her fellow YAGM, Casey, into her home on Easter Day to show them how to make Ngallax (the traditional dessert made by Christians at Easter) and then accompany them as they share it with their Muslim neighbors, family, and friends.

I give thanks every day for our faithful YAGM partners in Senegal, for they truly show us what it means to walk and work together.



Pastor Fulgence had planned to be a doctor before God called him into pastoral ministry. He and YAGMs Lily compared life stories when they learned that she too had planned to be a doctor, but now looks to enter seminary this fall.

Go and Tell

Mark writes in his Gospel in chapter 2: 1-12 the account of the four men with the paralytic friend. They found out that Jesus had come back to Capernaum and immediately got their good friend and carried him to the house that Jesus was in, but were unable to get inside because of the immense crowd literally packed inside. Oftentimes I've said that I try to imagine what was going on inside the hearts and minds of the various people that come to Jesus or in this case are brought to Jesus. When the four men realized that there was no way they were going to get their friend past the people wedged in the doorway, I would probably have thought they needed to wait until Jesus came back out, as it was inevitable He had to come out eventually. Something was going on with the paralytic man that caused his friends to respond as if they were taking him to one of our ER rooms at a hospital. They didn't have time to wait. He needed Jesus' help now! We don't know much about the paralytic. Did he have a wife and maybe a family? How long had he been paralyzed? I can only speculate, but my guess is that he had lost his will to live and his health was failing fast. He probably felt God had totally rejected him.



("Why else would this happen to me? I'm of no use to anyone anymore.") His friends must have been some very special people to not only carry him there, but to come up with the idea and have the guts to tear off somebody else's roof so that they could lower him down in front of Jesus. I'm sure they asked Jesus to help him if the paralytic didn't.

I'm sure there were many lives changed in that instance when Jesus first said, "My son, your sins are forgiven," and then to prove that what He said was true, He said, "Rise, take up your pallet and go home." The four men on the roof probably had tears of joy in their eyes, having seen what they could never have imagined would take place. I wonder if anyone present there later asked Jesus if their sins could be forgiven too. I sure hope they were beginning to understand what Jesus was saying when He spoke to them.
